### DRESSING FOR THE CARNIVAL



I want my work to be entirely open; to hold everything. In the studio, any thought or impulse that comes into my mind has to be carried out. Grids, borders, and repetition make the chaos of chance and random impulse visible. The grid collages are the grand stage. The 6"x6" portraits and sculptures are the actors. The folded drawings are a calendar.





#### II

This work started when I saw Winslow Homer's *Dressing for the Carnival* in the exhibition, *The Civil War*, at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. The painting drew me in I made pen drawings, mapping relationships, rather than pictorially recreating the painting. I found deep layers of complexity: formal, racial, American relationships. The title of the painting, and the title of this show, is "Dressing for the Carnival."








#### Ш

In the portraits of nineteenth century painter Jacques-Louis David, I saw the perfect version of my own paintings of imagined women. In my paintings I tried to be true to David's image. However, as I painted the same portrait of David's repeatedly, each time a unique personality came though. My interest then broadened to other portraits, past and present, including portraits from stock photos of Peter Falk as Colombo and of Dianne Carroll, the first female African American to have her own television show. I painted my waiter from a neighborhood restaurant as well as strangers who agreed to be photographed.

#### IV

At the Museum of Biblical Art, sculptures from the Florence Cathedral inspired me to build clay figures in response to Profetino by Donatello and Nanni di Banco. As with Jacques-Louis David, I recognized these to be perfect versions of my aspirations for my sculpty figures. I felt the affinity — I make small hand built figures out of craft store clay while looking at a reproduction of marble sculpture made for a Fifteenth Century cathedral. It is not copying; it's dancing to their music.







#### $\mathbf{V}$

Both collages, Every Other Year, and William Alpert and Terry Adkins, 2015, are archeological sites where drawings have been torn, buried, lost, worked on for over three years. I searched for imagery that was emblematic and metaphoric: globe, bird, boat, skull and bones, guns, flowers, shoes, praying hands, and my drawings from Winslow Homer's Dressing for the Carnival. There is no hierarchy between accidental rips, and drips and deliberate drawing and painting: a fine line between everything and nothing. Artist William Alpert, my neighbor, died this year and to remember him, I added his name to the work. I'd never included personal events in my work before; I never allowed myself to use words. Terry Adkins, an artist and colleague, whose path I crossed while teaching, died suddenly. Tucked in to the left side of the collage, I wrote his name, in reaction to the seeming randomness of his death. Globes, and their voids orbit with a gravitational force.
